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This Technical Memorandum provides an overview of potential historic resources located on Fort Monmouth. The goal of this evaluation is to assess the current state of preservation initiatives, determine future preservation options, and determine the potential and suitability of the facilities within Fort Monmouth for redevelopment. It includes a summary of previous cultural resource studies; an overview of the current preservation status; recommendations for future efforts related to cultural resources; an overview of the building assessment; and individual survey forms for each building surveyed.

Today, the majority of the base's early, Colonial Revival structures remain on the Main Post and form a distinct core. Newer structures have been erected to the west of these original buildings on the Main Post. Camp Charles Wood includes both a 1920s country club and mid-20<sup>th</sup> century residences that continue the Colonial Revival tradition that defines the earlier Main Post. Within the Main Post and Camp Charles Wood, several historic districts have been defined, as well as several buildings that possess individual significance. The majority of buildings are in fair to good condition. Levels of architectural integrity vary.

**Approach**

In completing this Cultural Resources Evaluation, Farewell Mills Gatsch first collected and reviewed existing cultural resources documents pertaining to Fort Monmouth. This material informed the subsequent survey of the buildings on the Main Post and Camp Charles Wood. Buildings were selected for survey based on the following criteria: permanence, reuse potential, size, historical significance, and known interest in reuse. During the course of field survey, teams confirmed existing surveys; located and briefly documented the selected structures (exterior survey was completed for each selected building, interior survey was completed for a portion of the buildings surveyed); and prepared evaluation forms for each building investigated. In addition, Farewell Mills Gatsch attended several meetings of the Historical Preservation Advisory Committee, which includes local officials and preservation commission members as well as the FMERPA historian, in order to understand and assist with local preservation concerns and areas of interest.

## Previous Cultural Resource Studies – Architectural Resources

A comprehensive summary of previous Cultural Resource Studies was included in the *Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan for Fort Monmouth, New Jersey 2007-2010* prepared by Versar Inc. (January 2007). The Plan identified six earlier architectural inventories:

### *Historic Properties Report, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and Sub Installations (Charles Wood Area and Evans Area)*

This study, completed in 1984 by Building Technologies, Inc (BTI), evaluated 71 buildings and associated garages and resulted in the identification of an historic district that encompassed the circa 1920s-1930s structures located on the Main Post (Buildings 115 – 328). A National Register of Historic Places nomination was prepared for the district and submitted to the New Jersey SHPO in 1983. Although the district nomination was returned with a request for additional information, the district was given an SHPO Opinion of Eligibility.

### *Inventory of Historic Buildings and Structures at Fort Monmouth*

The Inventory of Historic Buildings and Structures at Fort Monmouth was prepared by TRC Mariah in 1996. This study was more comprehensive than the BTI study, and included an intensive-level inventory of 341 buildings and structures located throughout both the Charles Wood area and Main Post (see attached Table 1 Listing of Architecturally Evaluated Buildings and Structures, prepared by TRC Mariah, for a list of buildings included in this study). Of these, a total of 98 structures were identified as eligible, the Main Post historic district was modified to eliminate several structures that had been altered, and a new historic district (The Charles Wood Historic District, centered on Gibbs Hall (Building 2000) and associated resources) was identified. The district includes Buildings 2000, 2001, 2018, 2019, and 2020, and encompasses the area between Tinton Avenue, Maxwell Road, and Lowther Drive.

### *Evaluation of Selected Cultural Resources at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey: Context for Cold War Era, Revision of Historic Properties Documentation, and Survey of Evans Area and Sections of Camp Charles Wood*

The 1996 study by Geo-Marine, Inc. focused solely on the evaluation of 39 structures within the Charles Wood area: 38 housing units and one chapel. None of these resources were found to be eligible for the National Register (NR); however, the housing had not yet reached 50 years of age at the time of the study.

### *Installation Cold War Inventory and Assessment, Fort Monmouth, Red Bank, Monmouth County, New Jersey*

Panamerican Consultants, Inc. prepared a study that was limited to investigation of Cold War resources at the Main Post and Charles Wood areas. Although 274 resources were documented, only two were ultimately evaluated as National Register eligible (meeting Criteria Consideration G): the Hexagon Building, and the associated support electrical substation (Buildings 2700 and 2701).

*Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan for Fort Monmouth, New Jersey*

The 2003 Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan (ICRMP) evaluated 39 buildings, almost all of which had been identified earlier in the 1996 TRC Mariah study but were not, at that time, 50 years of age. The Plan concluded that the World War II Memorial (Building 115) was NR eligible as a contributing element of the defined Fort Monmouth Historic District. The Fort Monmouth Historic District comprises the circa 1920s and 1930s structures located on the Main Post. In addition, 32 duplexes located in the Charles Wood area were identified as eligible as a district under Criterion A for their association with the expansion of Fort Monmouth and Camp Charles Wood during the Post-War era.

*Architectural Survey and Evaluation of Buildings 2705, 2707, 2708, 2709, 2710, and 2713 and Boundary Assessment of Fort Monmouth Historic District, Fort Monmouth, Eatontown, Monmouth County, New Jersey*

Versar, Inc.'s 2006 architectural survey evaluated six buildings, five associated with the Pulse Power Center and one with the Electronic Warfare Laboratory. Although these buildings are associated with Cold War-era scientific research and material development at Fort Monmouth, and were identified as potentially NR eligible in the 2003 ICRMP, Versar, Inc. determined that none were eligible, largely because they had not yet reached 50 years of age and did not possess exceptional significance under Criteria Consideration G. Importantly, the Versar study also re-assessed the boundary of the proposed Fort Monmouth Historic District. Although TRC Mariah's study had recommended removal of several buildings from the district due to alterations, Versar recommended retention of the boundaries as originally defined.

Versar, Inc.'s 2007 *Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan for Fort Monmouth, New Jersey 2007-2010* outlined goals for Fort Monmouth's Cultural Resources, including: submit 2006 assessment of the district boundary for the Fort Monmouth Historic District to the New Jersey SHPO; request concurrence with survey and evaluation findings from New Jersey SHPO, specifically 32 structures identified as eligible within the 2003 ICRMP; complete survey and evaluations for 31 buildings that will reach 50 years of age by 2010; train maintenance staff in the repair of historic properties. According to the New Jersey SHPO, as of September 2007 no additional submissions or requests for concurrence have been received.

## **Current Preservation Status**

At present, no buildings, structures, or objects within the boundaries of Fort Monmouth are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. A total of 136 buildings, structures, and objects have, however, been identified as eligible for listing. The majority of these resources are contributing elements of identified historic districts. Only seven buildings have been identified as individually eligible for listing (Buildings 115, 283, 2700, 2701, 2570, and two Dymaxion Deployment Units which are unnumbered). Of those seven, two are also identified as contributing elements of historic districts: Buildings 115 (WWII Monument), and 283 (Squier Hall).

In determining the significance of Ft. Monmouth's resources, the ability of the resources to meet one or more of the criteria outlined by the National Register of Historic Places was taken into consideration. The National Register Bulletin states, "The quality of significance in American history, architecture, archaeology, and culture is present in districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects that possess integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association, and:

- A. that are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history; or
- B. that are associated with the lives of persons significant in our past; or
- C. that embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or
- D. that have yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history

In addition, Criteria Considerations were also weighed. Ordinarily cemeteries, birthplaces, or graves of historical figures, properties owned by religious institutions or used for religious purposes, structures that have been moved from their original locations, reconstructed historic buildings, properties primarily commemorative in nature, and properties that have achieved significance within the past 50 years shall not be considered eligible for the National Register. However, such properties will qualify if they are integral parts of districts that do meet the criteria or if they fall within the following categories:

- (a) A religious property deriving primary significance from architectural or artistic distinction or historical importance; or
- (b) A building or structure removed from its original location but which is significant primarily for architectural value, or which is the surviving structure most importantly associated with a historic person or event; or
- (c) A birthplace or grave of a historical figure of outstanding importance if there is no appropriate site or building directly associated with his productive life.

(d) A cemetery which derives its primary significance from graves of persons of transcendent importance, from age, from distinctive design features, or from association with historic events; or

(e) A reconstructed building when accurately executed in a suitable environment and presented in a dignified manner as part of a restoration master plan, and when no other building or structure with the same association has survived; or

(f) A property primarily commemorative in intent if design, age, tradition, or symbolic value has invested it with its own exceptional significance; or

(g) A property achieving significance within the past 50 years if it is of exceptional importance.

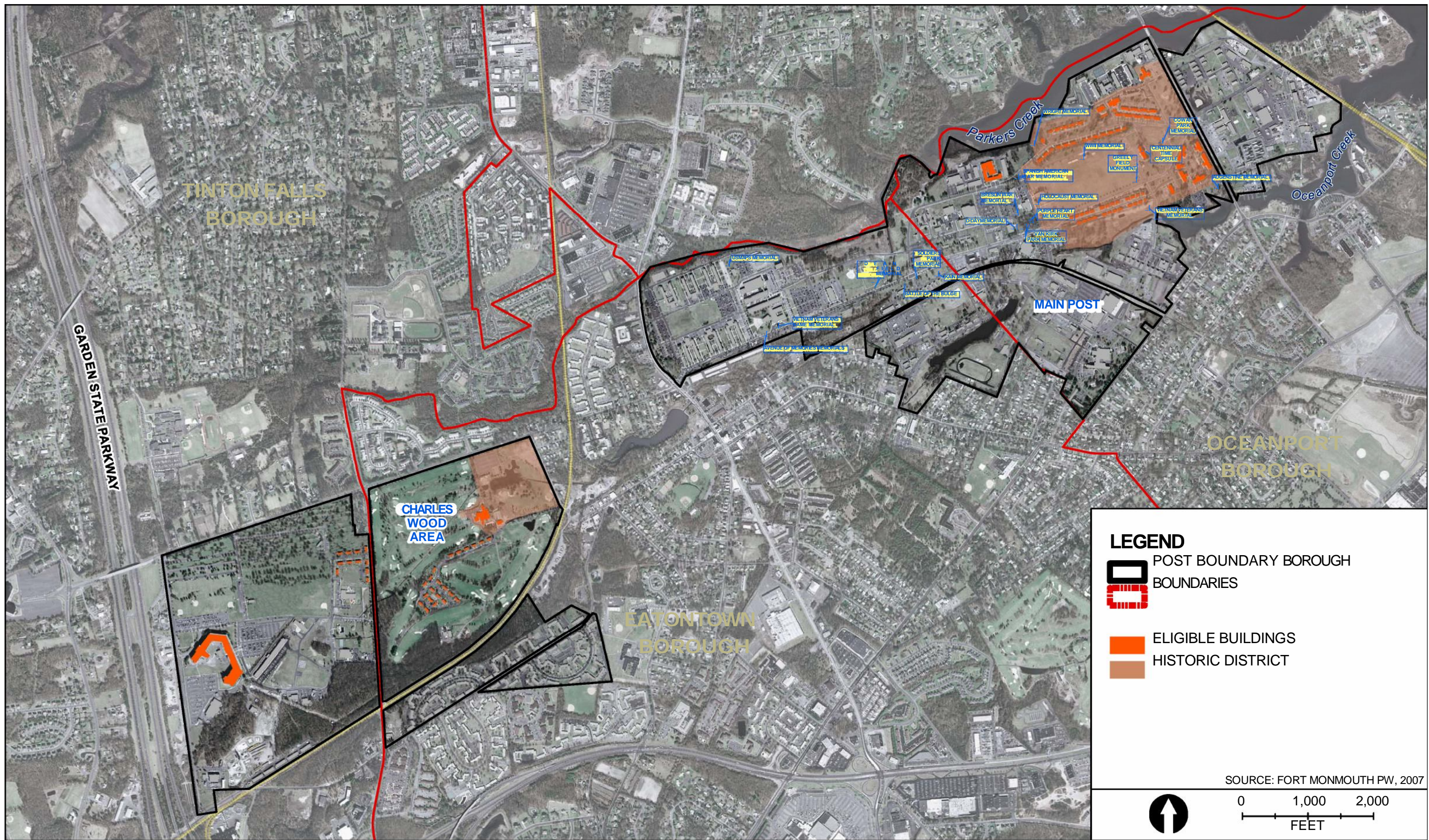
Three historic districts have been defined and identified as eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The largest of the districts is the Fort Monmouth Historic District, which comprises 94 resources that date from the late 1920s through the mid-1930s, with one exception (the WWII Memorial, dating to 1952). The district, shown in Figure 1, is roughly bounded by Allen Avenue in the north; Oceanport Avenue in the east; and Malterer Avenue in the west. The southern boundary is to the south of the buildings that line Gosselin Avenue. The resources included in the Fort Monmouth Historic District are largely of brick construction, and represent a range of uses, including offices and administrative functions, family housing, garages, and a fire station. The Parade Ground (and associated WWII Memorial) is also located within the district boundaries. Stylistically, the buildings represent a number of interpretations of the Colonial Revival Style; however, Russel Hall (Building 286), which stands at the heart of the district, is an imposing Art Deco style building that retains a number of its original decorative features. Prior studies have determined that the Fort Monmouth Historic District meets National Register Criteria A and C, as it represents Fort Monmouth's early years of development as an Army base (TRC Mariah Associates, Inc., 1996). A National Register of Historic Places nomination form was prepared for this district and submitted to the New Jersey SHPO in 1983. While the district was never listed as the nomination was not "technically complete," the SHPO did determine the district eligible.

The Camp Charles Wood Historic District encompasses the area roughly square area bounded by Tinton Avenue, Maxwell Road, and Lowther Drive. This district contains far fewer structures but is nearly as large as the Fort Monmouth Historic District in area. The focal point of the district is Gibbs Hall (Building 2000), a 1926, Tudor Revival style golf clubhouse that was originally constructed as the Sun Eagles Country Club. Gibbs Hall (Building 2000) and its accompanying outbuildings (Buildings 2001, 2018, 2019, and 2020), as well as the surrounding golf course (originally designed by A. W. Tillinghast, a well-known golf course architect) are contained within the historic district. Prior studies have determined that the Camp Charles Wood Historic District meets National Register Criteria A and C "for its local historical significance as a well known early twentieth century private golf club, and as an outstanding example of Tudor Revival Style architecture" (TRC Mariah Associates, Inc., 1996).





Finally, an unnamed Residential Historic District located to either side of Hope Road at the center of the Charles Wood portion of the base was identified as eligible in 2003 (John Milner Associates, Inc.). This district includes a total of 32 housing units, constructed circa 1949 to 1955. The units are two-stories in height and Colonial Revival in style. The buildings were constructed as duplexes and represent the earliest housing to be constructed within the Charles Wood area. As such, they are significant for their association with the post-World War II efforts of Fort Monmouth, which focused on communications research and development.

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## **Recommendations**

### Additional Studies

The study of prehistoric and historic period archaeological resources was not included within the scope of this report. Four archaeological studies have been conducted at Fort Monmouth to date, although only one of those has included subsurface testing.

Additional archaeological investigation that incorporates a program of subsurface testing is recommended to complement the information that has already been gathered on Fort Monmouth's above-ground resources and present a more complete picture of the cultural resources associated with the development of this site. It is important to complete archaeological investigations prior to the commencement of any new building on the Fort Monmouth property.

### Historic Designation

Only one of the identified historic districts (the Fort Monmouth Historic District) has been defined and submitted to the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office as a National Register of Historic Places Nomination to date. The nomination process has not moved forward, and likely requires additional information and updating.

FMERPA should consider proceeding with the designation process for the Fort Monmouth Historic District, and should also consider preparing National Register of Historic Places Nominations for the additional historic districts (Camp Charles Wood and Residential Historic District) that have been defined as well as for the individual buildings (Buildings 115, 283, 2700, 2701, 2570, and two Dymaxion Deployment Units which are unnumbered) that have been identified as eligible for listing.

One of the primary areas of concern for the Historical Preservation Advisory Committee is the documentation and preservation of existing markers that denote sites of historical significance. FMERPA should consider working with the Advisory Committee (which has compiled a list of historical markers, attached as Table 1) to achieve their goals for the markers. One option that has been considered is the creation of a memorial park.

In addition, the Historical Preservation Advisory Committee has discussed the importance of ensuring that all three towns (Eatontown, Oceanport, and Tinton Falls) have existing preservation ordinances and that those ordinances have been updated.

### Section 106 Compliance

In considering the adaptive use of Fort Monmouth's historic resources, proposed projects will be required to participate in the Section 106 review process. Section 106 review (which refers to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966) requires federal agencies to consult with the State Historic Preservation Officer prior to implementing projects that impact historic properties. The review process will require the project team to work with the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office to reach a consensus regarding the eligibility of the resource in question, and then to evaluate the effect of the proposed project on that resource.

The historic preservation review process mandated by Section 106 is outlined in regulations issued by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP). Revised regulations, "Protection of Historic Properties" (36 CFR Part 800), became effective January 11, 2001.
